ITU Report on "Power of ICTs in tackling climate change"

Information and communication technologies (ICTs) are of fundamental importance in reducing greenhouse-gas (GHG) emissions, as well as in helping countries everywhere adapt to climate change and to deal with its sometimes catastrophic effects. This is the message of a report launched recently by ITU and the Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI) on Using ICTs in tackling climate change. The report describes, with concrete examples, how ICTs can achieve these goals in three main ways: By driving down emissions in the ICT sector itself; By cutting emissions and raising energy efficiency in other sectors and By using ICT-based systems to monitor weather and the environment worldwide, as well as to swiftly transmit data, analysis and alerts. ICT News Headlines & Briefs

- Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) plans to recruit up to 15,000 in the quarter ending March.
- Whistleblowing Web site WikiLeaks will now turn its attention to some of the world's richest people reportedly detailing massive tax evasion.
- Bahwan CyberTek Pvt Ltd (BCT) signed a memorandum of understanding with Ramanujan Computing Centre (RCC), located in Anna University (AU), Chennai, to collaborate on technology-focused research and development.
- HCL Infosystems bags an order from Keltron to provide over 6,500 units of 'HCL ME' laptops and netbooks for the Kerala Government's IT@School project.
- The tax authorities' demand on Infosys to fork out Rs 400 crore has drawn sharp reactions from across the IT industry.
- The UK-based Pearson Group has acquired a controlling stake in online tutorial TutorVista Global for Rs 577 crore.
- Nasscom has asked the UK to include employee allowances and benefits in the minimum salary cut-off (of £40,000) that UK proposes for Intra-Company Transfer (ICT) workers, whose stay exceeds 12 months.
- If TCS manages to maintain its current pace of growth, it will be able to realise its vision of clocking \$10 billion by the end of fiscal 2011-12 -- Mr S. Mahalingam, Chief Financial Officer, TCS.
- TCS has tweaked its policy related to employee promotions, in a bid to retain more staffers. Senior staffers at TCS will now be eligible for promotions twice a year — in January and June.
- Cognizant is expecting to maintain its recruitments for 2011 at the same level (25,000) as last calendar year.
- The Prime Minister, Mr Manmohan Singh, inaugurates Mobile Number Portability services across the country on 20th Jan 2011.
- The mobile trading platform launched in October last year by the exchanges and a handful of brokers is picking up. Sees about Rs 2 crore worth of average daily turnover.
- The 'Akshaya' model of e-services delivery will now provide Intel's latest curriculum module 'Technology and Entrepreneurship' (TEN) through its 2,200 customer service centres (CSCs) across Kerala which introduces learners to basic concepts and process of entrepreneurship, and demonstrates how technology can be used to advance a business idea.
- Inclusive growth is objective of broadband rollout, says Sibal.
- RIM is planning to launch \$150m BlackBerry Partners Fund for India to provide seed funding and venture capital to start-ups working in the area of wireless communications.
- HCL Info arm to sell networking business to Tikona Digital.
- Telecom stocks were under pressure as mobile number portability (MNP) was introduced pan-India.

- A five-member delegation from the German city of Kaiserslautern visits Technopark campus and the office of the Kerala State IT Mission to seek opportunities of bilateral collaboration and identifying and adopting best practices from both places.
- BSA launches course for SMEs on software asset management
- Probe 2G scam without being influenced: Apex court tells CBI.
- Wipro announces a major change in leadership in a bid to shore up its fortunes. Wants a "simpler, leaner organisation" structure after the exit of joint CEOs.
- The Electronics Corporation of Tamil Nadu has allocated land to 6 companies in the Hosur IT SEZ, as a part of its initiative in promoting IT in Tier-II cities.
- AP plans two new IT parks in Hyderabad with a total investment of over Rs 2000 crore.
- Honeywell team now tracks 14,000 aircraft on distant skies from Hyderabad. Will be expanding its R&D facility in Hyderabad with over Rs 100 crore.
- The top five companies are estimated to hire 1.6 to 1.8 lakh employees over the next 12 months, says Infosys CEO.
- BSNL, RCom bear initial brunt of mobile number portability.
- The value-added services (VAS) segment accounts for 12-18 per cent of the overall revenue of telecom service providers and will double in the next few years: RCom.
- Digital imaging and printing solutions provider, Epson, has opened its 'procentre' here to display its range of large format professional graphics printers.
- Implement number portability properly or face penalty, DoT tells operators.
- Telephone user base reaches 764 million. The overall tele-density in India reaches 64.34. Wireless tele-density stands at 61.38.
- TRAI seeks views on pricing mobile banking services.
- Infosys looking to rehire, tap ex-staff.
- Yahoo! working towards 'smart' search
- BlackBerry maker Research In Motion (RIM) has said it was technically not possible to provide access to corporate email services for security monitoring
- Within 72 hours of launch, 1 lakh hook up for Airtel 3G.
- Centre likely to sanction 9 IT projects of AP Govt involving a total investment of Rs 2,500 crore, on a cost-sharing basis.
- HP is setting up a data centre in India that will host and manage infrastructure for its cloud computing customers.
- The much-awaited Apple iPad was launched in India on 28th Jan 2011.
- Mr Ashok Soota, Co-Founder and Executive Chairman of MindTree, resigns from the company. Plans to start a new business venture.
- Uninor, the joint mobile company between Telenor and Unitech, has approached the Supreme Court challenging the hike in spectrum usage charges by the DOT. Incumbent GSM operators Bharti Airtel, Vodafone Esar and Idea, have already filed an appeal against the DoT's decision.
- 'Rent-A-Phone' (RAP), a new mobile phone service being introduced by the Delhi-based Vincegrass Creative Solutions Pvt. Ltd. Payment of rents may range from Rs 10 to 60 a day, depending on the cost of the handset that would range from Rs 4,800 to Rs 60,000.
- Reliance Communications (RCom) launches Missed Call Alert with Notify Me alert to the callers that the person is now available to receive a call from them.
- The World Bank estimates that by 2012, 1.7 billion people across emerging markets will have mobile phones and one in five of them will be picking up mobile money to create a \$5 billion market by 2012.
