- Mobile Value Added Services (MVAS) to become a Rs 67,100 cr market by 2015 contributing to 31% of overall wireless revenues.
- The worldwide BPO market to grow by 6.3% in 2011 and 5% in 2012. – Gartner Report.
- The KPO currently pegged at \$2 b in India is expected to touch \$5.6 b in 2015 at a compounded growth of 22%. Share of data analytics is expected to increase from 18.5% to 20.6% (\$1.15 billion) and LPO is expected to be \$1.3 billion. – Nasscom study
- If the US slips into a double-dip recession, it would lead to tech job losses there as well as in India but it could have an even bigger fallout: 'out-of-job' software engineers lured into cybercrime gangs to produce malware.-- Internet Crime Complaint Centre
